STATEMENT BY THE DELEGATION OF GERMANY

Mr. Chairperson,

As I am sure you recall, at the 646th meeting of the Forum for Security Co-operation on 1 June 2011, the Republic of Serbia requested assistance with the reconstruction of storage facilities and support for the destruction of phosphorous ammunition and napalm powder. Approximately 94,000 euros are required for the destruction of the napalm.

I am pleased to be able to inform you today that the Federal Republic of Germany will now provide the total amount of 94,000 euros for the destruction of the napalm powder.

We are convinced of the usefulness of this whole project in Serbia and would be pleased if the other parts of this important project could also be implemented quite quickly with the assistance of other sponsors.
