

In April, Coalitions against Hate (CaHs) across BiH joined forces to assist in providing vulnerable social groups with humanitarian aid. The CaHs collected information on those in need, compiling the most desperately required equipment and food for each category, including elderly persons, single mothers, and returnees. Aid packages will be provided by the OSCE Mission to BiH and World Vision.
